























RICE & LARPENTEUR COMMUNITY

2022 HIGHLIGHTS











- Lamplighter Lounge closed permanently in March. A familyowned grocery store to open soon.
- Over 40 community members helped at our Spring Clean Up event on April 23.
- Our Community In Bloom event was held May 21 at Lake McCarrons Park, connecting residents to the waterfront and honoring the contributions of artists to the Rice & Larpenteur area.
- The Summer Block Party gathered over 500 community members on August 13 at the MyThrift Store Parking Area.
- Small Business Committee launched and Rice & Larpenteur Alliance Business Networking Luncheon held at Hearthside Pizza.
- Neighborhood businesses tour was held with MCCD and Open To Business.
- Artist generated utility box wraps were installed through Capitol Region Watershed District grant "Connecting Community To Lake McCarrons Through Public Art".
- Rice Street to become a future Bus Rapid Transit route—which will be a transformational infrastructure investment in the region.
- Ramsey County ReVision Rice Street road design unveiled from Pennsylvania to Wheelock Pkwy.
- New! Rice & Larpenteur Alliance Youth Ambassadors internship program launched employing four local high school students to work in the neighborhood during the Spring and Summer.
- Volunteers packed groceries for our neighbors and promoted Rice & Larpenteur Alliance events at Cub Foods on the day before Thanksgiving.
- Over 250 neighbors gathered at the Winter Warm-Up on December 3 in the Crown Plaza Parking Area.
- Engaged over 40 community businesses and organizations in sponsorship of the Rice & Larpenteur Alliance!
- Conducted a Winter Wear Drive in partnership with the City of Maplewood and Costco.
- Worked with EPA funded technical assistance for brownfields program to create a strategy for healthy redevelopment of public and private lands.
- Fundraised through corporate and individual giving as well as philanthropic grants and government contracts to create sustainable organizational funding.
- Worked to connect local businesses with business grants, loans, and technical assistance through programs like Open to Business, Workforce Solutions, BizRecycling, and Worksite Wellness.



2022 FINANCIALS

The Rice & Larpenteur Alliance is funded primarily through a contract with the Cities of Maplewood, Roseville, and Saint Paul. In 2022, the Alliance also successfully secured operating grants from the Saint Paul and Minnesota Foundation and the F.R. Bigelow Foundation, and earned cash and in-kind donations from individuals and a growing list of local businesses. The operating budget for the year (March 2022-February 2023) was about \$200,000. The largest expense continues to be professional services by the St Paul Area Chamber followed by programs, grants, events, and marketing.
